She is the Maine PBIS (Positive Behavioral Intervention and Support) Coordinator and currently facilitates many districts and schools in this work as they become implementers of PBIS. Pat is also Co-coordinator of SMART (Southern Maine Area Resource Team) for Schools providing assessment, consulting and professional development to address learning and behavior needs of children throughout Maine. She also serves as a behavior consultant to the Falmouth Public Schools and provides inservice professional development to schools throughout Maine.

Chuck Saufier received a M.Ed. from Northeastern University in Community Mental Health in 1979. He has been a guidance counselor and staff trainer in Maine since 1989. As Co-coordinator of the Maine Project Against Bullying, he coordinated a statewide bullying prevention project. He is currently a trainer/consultant for Safe Schools for All and the Restorative Practices Collaborative of Maine. He is a founding member of the International Bullying Prevention Association and provides professional development opportunities in community building, prevention, and developmentally appropriate intervention.

Directions to the Samoset (594-2511)...

From Portland (78 miles)...

I-295 North to Exit #28 to Route 1 North (Coastal Route); Route 1 North through Rockland; 1/3 mile beyond McDonald's (left) and Burger King (right), turn right at the traffic light onto Waldo Avenue (Littlefield Baptist Church), 1/2 mile on Waldo Avenue to the Samoset Resort.

From Augusta (42 miles)...

Route 17 East approximately 41 miles, then Route 17 bears right, proceed straight - 1/2 mile to Route 1 (McDonald's on left), turn left onto Route 1 North 1/3 mile, turn right at the traffic light onto Waldo Avenue (Littlefield Baptist Church), 1/2 mile on Waldo Avenue to the Samoset Resort.

From Bangor (61 miles)...

Route 1A South to Route 1 South through Belfast and Camden; 7 miles beyond Camden turn left onto Warrenton Street just past the Glen Cove Rest Area, 1 mile on Warrenton Street to the Samoset Resort.

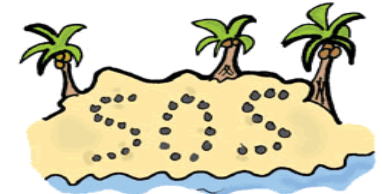
